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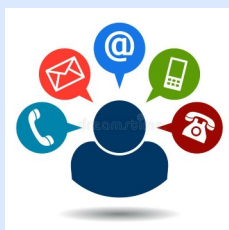
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## In Your Prayers...

## Church Business

From the Minutes of the October PCC Meeting, concerns regarding movement in the church's East Elevation, which in turn have caused movement in the William Morris East Window continue. The advice received at this point is to consult the Diocesan Buildings and Fabric Advisor to agree a strategy to manage both issues. Time would appear to be on our side though as the movement has taken since 1864, but weather extremes do speed up the process.

Following concerns raised about the surface of the graveyard extension quotes are being sought to rectify the issues.

No further updates on the break-in of the church in May had been received. Items stolen will be replaced under the terms of the insurance policy however.

Following a low-key period of fund-raising, the 2026 events calendar is already filling. Recent events have raised for St Olave's and all who have worked hard are thanked for helping to contribute to a small profit reported in the latest quarterly accounts.



## Harvest Festival

St Olave's was able to donate a very large offering to the Food Bank thanks to the enormous generosity of the congregation at Harvest Festival (with thanks to the donor of three large bags of goods left outside the main door). Numbers at the Service were swelled by a large contingent from Seaview with a couple amongst their number intending to get married in the church next year.

Lay Reader, Richard Smout, led the Morning Prayer Service which naturally included traditional harvest hymns, readings, prayers and one of Richard's, as always, thought provoking talks.

The happy ambience continued after the Service when most people stayed for coffee and cake, giving them also the opportunity to further admire the beautiful flower arrangements decorating the windows.

## Gatcombe Grape Harvest 2025

Last weekend marked a special milestone for Gatcombe Estate, as around twenty of us gathered to bring in this year's grape harvest. Under largely clear autumn skies, we picked our way through the young vines, filling crate after crate until we had gathered an impressive 1.7 tonnes of fruit. For a vineyard still in its early years, this yield was a heartening sign of promise and progress. The day was filled with laughter, teamwork, and the rhythm of shared effort — the kind of harvest atmosphere that reminds us why these vines have been planted.

Once the last crates were brought in, everyone lent a hand tossing the grapes into the crusher, watching as the fruit that had been nurtured all season was transformed into the beginnings of something new. With the combined expertise of wine maker, Adam Lawson and estate manager, George Watts, the grape must begins its slow journey toward becoming our still rosé and pinot noir. The harvest may be over, but the story of this vintage is just beginning — and it's one we'll all remember as a step forward for Gatcombe Estate.
